Goals / remit of your organisation:

1)EuroScience is an association active throughout all fields of science, i.e. the social sciences and humanities, mathematics and computer science, natural, medical and technical sciences.

2)EuroScience is a pan-European platform for scientists, engineers, students and all those interested in the pursuit of science and technology for the greatest benefit of European society with the objectives

- to provide its members with an effective voice in discussions and policy making about science and technology and society in Europe;
- to promote a scientific culture and a dialogue and mutual understanding between science and society, amongst others in order to warrant the free, but responsible pursuit of knowledge to the greatest benefit of society;
- to foster a European spirit amongst its members through discussions of issues common to all;
- to facilitate co-operation between all stakeholders in science and technology in Europe, and thus contribute to the understanding of science and technology as a common endeavour for the benefit of Europe and its citizens;
- to further collaboration among European scientific institutions, as well as scientific and technological relations between Europe and the rest of the world.

3)It will pursue these objectives by actively engaging in study, debate, publications, providing platforms, and any other requisite activities, including taking part in any association or group if that contributes to achieving EuroScience's objectives, at the European as well as national levels.

4) In order to pursue its objectives, EuroScience also initiates and participates in the organisation of scientific conferences in Europe that bring together stakeholders in science and technology in an open forum with a free exchange of information across disciplines and between science and society. These ESOF (European Science Open Forum) meetings are complemented by smaller topical meetings and by regional meetings.

EuroScience organises every two years the EuroScience Open Forum (ESOF). Its organisation is partly outsourced to a Local Organisation. ESOF is not meant to influence policy, rather to provide a platform for discussions on new science, but also on science and policy. Commissioners, EC staff members, European Parliamentarians participate on a regular basis. In the interest of transparency, staff of the Local Organisation (including the ESOF Champion and Vice-Champion) will use the EuroScience registration, in case their activities are anywhere near activities covered by the Register.

- d ensure that, to the best of their knowledge, information which they provide upon registration and subsequently in the framework of their activities within the scope of the register is complete, up-to-date and not misleading;
- e not sell to third parties copies of documents obtained from any EU institution;
- f not induce Members of the EU institutions, officials or other staff of the EU, or assistants or trainees of those Members, to contravene the rules and standards of behaviour applicable to them;
- g if employing former officials or other staff of the EU or assistants or trainees of Members of the EU institutions, respect the obligation of such employees to abide by the rules and confidentiality requirements which apply to them;
- h observe any rules laid down on the rights and responsibilities of former Members of the European Parliament and the European Commission;
- i inform whomever they represent of their obligations towards the EU institutions;

Individuals representing or working for entities which have registered with the European Parliament with a view to being issued with a personal, non-transferable badge affording access to the European Parliament's premises shall::

- j comply strictly with the provisions of Rule 9 of, and Annex X and the second paragraph of Article 2 of Annex I to, the European Parliament's Rules of Procedure;
- k satisfy themselves that any assistance provided in the context of Article 2 of Annex I to the European Parliament's Rules of Procedure is declared in the appropriate register;
- l in order to avoid possible conflicts of interest, obtain the prior consent of the Member or Members of the European Parliament concerned as regards any contractual relationship with or employment of a Member's assistant, and subsequently declare this in the register;
